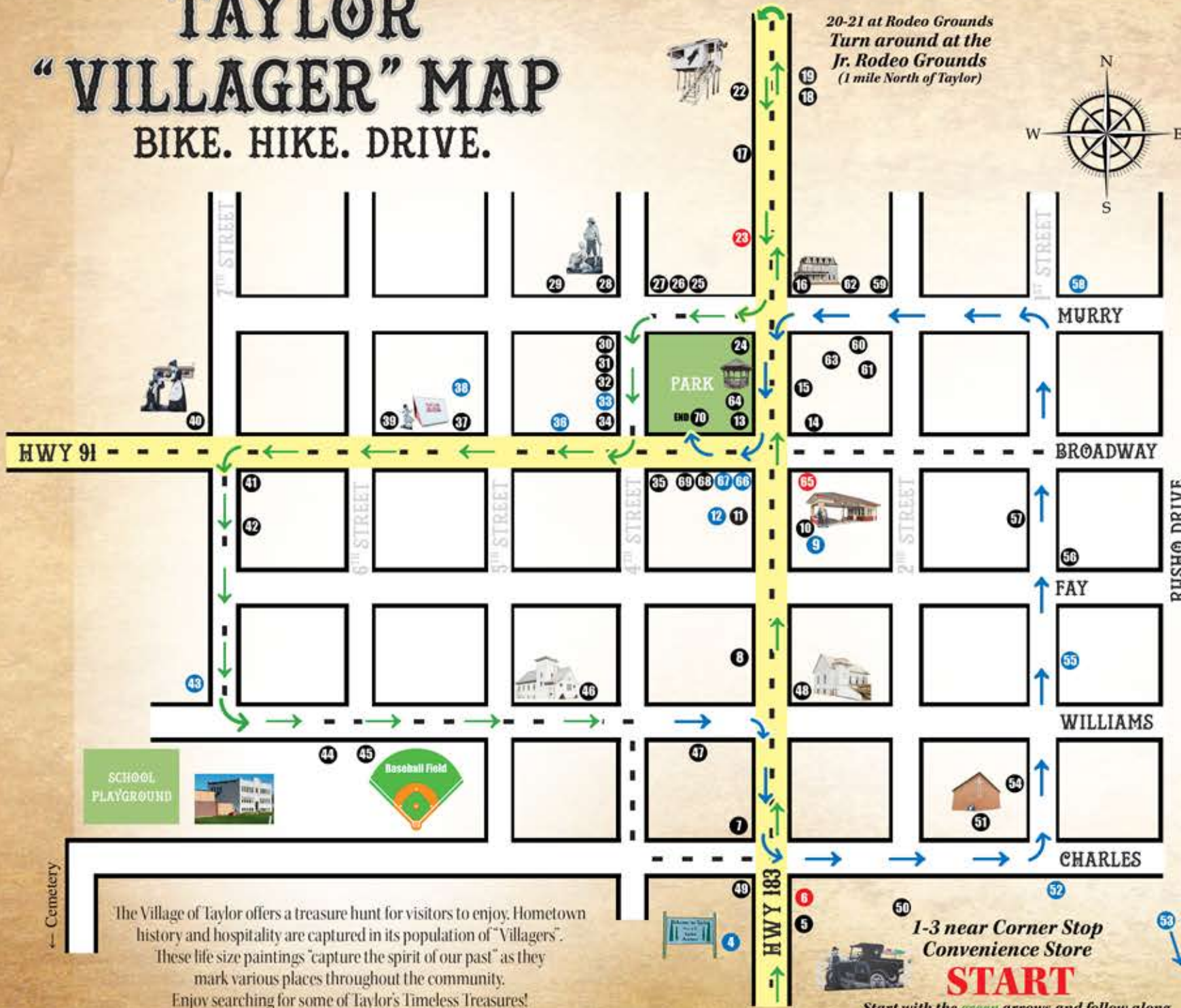


TAYLOR
